
Introduction

WHY WE NEED TO HEAR GOD'S VOICE

He Made us to Hear His Voice

- **John 10:27** My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me:
 - Does God really speak today?
 - o Will He speak to me personally?
 - o Can I actually hear and understand Him?
- Is it that important that I hear the voice of God?
 - o We were created with a longing inside of us to hear our Master's voice.
 - o He created us to have fellowship with Him.
 - You cannot get to know Him unless you can have a two-way conversation with Him.
 - Rev 3:20 Behold, I stand at the door, and knock: if any man hear my voice, and opens the door, I will come in to him, and will sup with him, and he with me.
- God has a plan and purpose for you and he wants to guide you into it.
 - o Do I need to rely on God's guidance and direction?
 - Does God actually have something important for me to do? If so, how do I find it out and walk in it?
 - Eph 2:10 Good works were planned for us before we existed.

- Col 4:17 Take heed to the *ministry* (official service), which thou hast received in the Lord, that thou *fulfill* (complete, fill to satisfaction, finish) it.
 - o Called to Leadership:
 - You have been called by God to become a powerful leader in the Body of Christ.
 - God chose to give you life and your life is extremely important for the advancing of the Kingdom of God.
 - o God is the only one who knows the best and safest passage.
 - **Jer 29:11** For I know the thoughts (*imaginations and intentions*) that I think (*esteem, reckon*) toward you, saith the LORD, thoughts of peace, and not of evil, to give you an expected end (*a future and a hope*).
 - *Knox:* I have not lost sight of my plan for you, the Lord says, and it is your welfare I have in mind, not your undoing; for you, too, I have a destiny and a hope.
 - o He does not treat you like a robot, because you're unique.
 - Matt 10:30 Your hairs are numbered.

- Don't try to be someone else.
- God guides you not just to take you from one place to the next but also to increase your knowledge of Him.

Summoned to God's Service

- **Eph 4:1** I therefore, the prisoner of the Lord, beseech you that ye walk worthy of the vocation (*calling*) wherewith ye are called He calls me into His Plan.
 - o God has a detailed will and plan for your life and He wants to tell us.
 - o Acts 22:14 God wants us to know His will and hear His voice.
- **Is 48:17** Thus saith the LORD, thy Redeemer, the Holy One of Israel; I am the LORD thy God which teacheth thee to profit (*be useful or profitable*, *valuable*), which leadeth thee by the way that thou shouldest go.
 - o You were created in the image of God.
 - o You are an expression of a divine idea.
 - o God's plan is not to turn out facsimiles but to develop and mature the unique personality He has given each of His children.
- **Rom 8:28** And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to *HIS* purpose.
 - When you love God and are walking in His will, all things will work out to your benefit.
- 2 Tim 1:9 Who hath saved us, and called us with a holy calling, not according to our works, but according to his own purpose and grace, which was given us in Christ Jesus before the world began.
 - o We miss God's best when we willfully determine to go "OUR" way
 - Things in our life can change instantaneously and our plans can fall apart but God's plans are secure in Christ.
- Ps 37:4 The only desires He wants to frustrate are those that will harm you and not help you.

God Doesn't Always Explain Himself but Requires you to Trust Him Anyway

- **Deut 29:29** Not only are the revealed things part of His plan but the secret things that we don't know and understand are also part of His plan.
 - o Some areas God will not reveal.

- Is 55:8-9 Our ways and His ways are different.
 - Don't be surprised or baffled of God's dealings with you in this world because some things belong to God alone and we will never understand them completely.
 - 1 Cor 2:8 Which none of the princes of this world knew: for had they known it, they would not have crucified the Lord of glory.
 - o We need to learn to trust God because he doesn't always explain Himself.
- **Ps 32:8** I will instruct thee and teach thee in the way which thou shalt go: I will guide thee with mine eye.
 - Our part is to be sensitive to the shepherds leading and follow Him.
 - David understood in Ps 23:2 that He leads us beside still waters.
 - **Prov 3:5-6** We are to trust Him with all your heart.
 - Much too often we rely on our own incite and understanding
- **Jer 10:23** It is not in man that walks to direct his steps.
 - o There is safety in following the shepherd wherever He goes.
 - o **John 10:11** He is the Good Shepherd.

Purpose for God's Plan

- **Titus 2:14** Who gave himself for us, that he might redeem us from all iniquity, and purify unto himself a peculiar people, zealous of good works.
- **Eph 2:10** For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.
 - He wants us to walk in good works, which he ordained for us.
- Matt 5:16 Let your light so shine before men, that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father which is in heaven.
 - o This is what our purpose is, to glorify the Father in all we do to bring glory to His name, to exalt Him among the people/nations/heathens.
 - o **John 17:4** Jesus said, I have glorified thee on the earth: I have finished the work which thou gavest me to do.
- 1 John 3:8...For this purpose the Son of God was manifested, that He might <u>destroy</u> the works of the devil.
 - o **Rev 1:5** says that Jesus was the first begotten from the dead.
 - o Since the Word says in **Rev 1:6** *JKV* that we are kings and priests and if Jesus being the first King and priest had a purpose for His life, then we, who are after Him and are also kings and priests, have the same high calling.

Conditions for Finding God's Will

- *Question:* I've done so much of my own thing. Can God still use me?
 - o **Jer 18:1-4** Potter & clay
 - Marred in the potters hands because of something lacking in the clay.
 - He corrected the defect reformed it into another pot.
 - God always has a best and perfect will that we will walk in, as we yield to Him
 - Never too late to make a new beginning and go back to His perfect will.
- Start with Faith.
 - o Don't be in doubt.
 - o Acquire confidence deep inside that He'll come through.
 - You get this through knowledge of Him and Who He is.
 - o **James 1:5-7** Ask Him in faith.
 - Seek after Him in prayer.
 - o Lay hold until you get an answer.
 - o **Ps 107:9** Intently desire because he satisfies the longing soul.
 - Seek with all your heart.
- **Jer 29:13** then you will seek me, inquire for, require me as a vital necessity, and find me when you search for me with all your heart. *JB Phillips*
 - Vs 13 Look for me, and you shall find me, if you will but look for me in good earnest –*Knox*
 - o Vs 14 I will let you find me, says the Lord. NEB
- **Ps 130:6** As you watch in darkness, the dawn comes slowly but is sure to come. The fresh new light of day will illuminate your path and you will receive guidance from the Lord.
 - The believing heart is a restful heart.
 - o If you trust in the Lord, you won't be afraid to wait.
 - o **Is 28:16** He who believes shall not make haste (be in a rush). *KJV*
 - *JP Phillips:* The man who trusts in me shall rest unmoved.
 - If you trust in the Lord, you will not be concerned about the wait.
 - o **Is 64:4** *Rotherham:* Although from age-past times, it was never heard it was not perceived by the ear, neither did the eye ever see that a god beside thee could work for the man who waited for him.
- Obey in all areas.
 - o Do we only want God's guidance when it's convenient for us?
 - He guides those who acknowledge Him in all their ways
 - o Do you expect for God to grant you further light if you haven't obeyed Him in the light He has already given you?

KEYS TO HEARING GOD

God Knows His Sheep and They Follow Him

- **John 10:26-27** Sheep hear the master's voice, He knows them and they follow Him.
 - o If you are a sheep, you should hear the Shepherds voice.
 - O Sheep are trained to only follow their master.
- You must believe God the Father wants to speak to you, not just to our Pastor or anyone else in the 5-fold ministry.
 - o God desires to speak and for us to hear His words.

The Master Key is Faith

- The bible is filled with dreams, visions, miracles and supernatural experiences.
 - We're taught not to expect these things
- God is omnipresent, omniscient, and omnipotent.
 - o Mark 9:23 Everything is possible to him who believes.
- Never be content with our present experience of God.
 - o **Heb 13:5** Be content with material possessions but never with God.
 - o Rev 3:14-22 To be content with God is to become Lukewarm.
- To hear God, it requires faith.
 - Everything operates by Faith.
 - Faith is the necessary ingredient to hear His voice.
 - Gal 2:20 Live by the Faith of the Son of God
 - The very same thing could happen to you if you gave God a chance to speak to you as He did to those in Acts.

Expect to hear from Him.

- o If you do not believe that God wants to speak to you, then it will not happen.
 - If you do not believe it is the will of God to hear Him, then you must deal with that unbelief.
 - Unbelief will hinder your ears from hearing.
 - God honors faith not unbelief.
- o Without expectation, there will never be fulfillment of hearing from God.
 - People are still sick and in poverty because they don't expect to be delivered from it.
- o The Word gives us a HOPE of expectation.
 - Expect Him to speak: He always has something to say.

- There is nothing wrong with the transmission.
 - o The receiver is not tuned in correctly.
 - o Tune into the channel W.O.R.D.
- Raise your faith level by saying you hear from God.
 - o Is 50:4-5 He has opened my ear to hear

How to Cure an Evil Heart of Unbelief

- **Heb 3:12** An evil heart of unbelief
- **Heb 3:11** They shall not enter into my rest.
 - o Israel had a heart of unbelief and they stayed in the wilderness for 40 years.
 - o God cannot do anything with you while you are in unbelief.
- Get belief before your eyes, ears and mouth gate.
 - o Take the Word of God and put it through those gates the same way you put unbelief in.
- IF your heart is not right, you are not going to hear from God.
 - Humble yourself and let God know that you rely on His voice for instruction, training and guidance.

Build Your Faith by Seeing God's Faithfulness to Others

- Adam & Eve: walked in the garden with them
 - o Gen 2:16 First time God spoke to Adam.
- Noah: Build an Ark
 - o Gen 6:12-22
 - Not vague impressions
 - Specific with measurements
- Abraham:
 - o **Gen 12:1** Get out of your country.
- The devil:
 - o Gen 3:14 The Lord God said to the serpent.

Obedience Leads to the Highest Form of Faith

- None of the Old Testament people were born-again.
 - o If OT saints could hear, so can you.
 - o IF the devil can hear, so can you.
 - We were created to hear Him.
- God is our air traffic controller—Commander-in-Chief.

- o When God tells you STOP and you say no, your ears get clogged up.
 - Hearing means obeying.
 - Heart becomes hard and less pliable every time you say NO to God.
- The same way He speaks to you about unrighteous things, He speaks to you about righteous things.
- The reason Abraham heard God in crucial times is because he had been hearing and obeying Him all along.
 - o God said, "Get up and go" and Abraham obeyed.
- Jesus claimed He could do nothing of himself.
 - o **John 5:30** He judges as he hears his Father judge.
 - o **John 7:16** His teaching is not his but the Father's.
 - o John 8:28 He speaks only the words of the Father.
 - o **John 14:10** The Works Jesus did were not his works but the Father's.
 - o John 14:31 What the Father commands, Jesus did.
- Jesus presented himself as a bond-slave to the Father under orders which He fulfilled out of love and unbroken communion.
 - o Jesus' heart was always to obey and it should be ours also.
- If you will not obey Him in the little things, why should He talk with you in crucial things because you won't obey anyway?
 - o What is your track record?

 It is obeying in the little things that show God you will obey in big to
--

Power to Perform:

- It's the ministry of the Holy Spirit in you that gives you the divine power.
- Jesus speaks the words of God and does all these things not out of His deity but by the Holy Spirit who rested upon Him without measure.
 - Jesus made better use of the Holy Spirit's power than anyone else did before or after.
 - o Jesus taught the disciples how to be empowered by the Holy Spirit.
 - o Act 6:3-5 & 7:55 Stephen and Phillip were full of the Spirit
 - Eph 1:17-20 We have this same power that the apostles had to hear God and perform miracles
 - Recognize the inheritance of mighty power we possess through Christ
- As you yield in obedience:
 - o Acts 2:14-41 Preach boldly
 - o Act 4:29-31 Courageous & powerful
 - o Acts 5:40-41 Face suffering cheerfully and joyfully
 - o Act 7:55-60 Accepted death with forgiveness on your lips
 - o Acts 9:36-41 Raise the dead

- o Acts 16:6 Where to go and not to go
- o Matt 10:8 Drive out demons
- o Acts 22:10-11 What to do and not to do
- o Acts 28:8 Heal the sick

I recommend a minimum of 15 minutes a day. The more you pray in the spirit, the more revelation you will receive from God and the clearer His voice will become. Memorize this week's scripture.

Scripture Memorization:

GOD SPEAKS THROUGH HIS WORD

God Speaks Through the Written Scriptures

- How do we know God's voice? God's voice will always match the Logos (written) of His Word, the Bible!
 - When God guides you or gives you direction, He does not nullify the scripture; neither will He change them to accommodate that voice!
 - EX: Whom should I marry?
 - * God is clear—do not be unequally yoked to an unbeliever.
 - * You do not even have to pray about it—the Word is clearly speaking.
 - EX: Do I need to come to church?
 - 1Cor 11:20 & 1 Cor 14:23 Come together
 - God is very clear—look up the word "together" in concordance
 - We are to come together regularly
- **Josh 1:8** This book of the law shall not depart out of thy mouth; but thou shalt meditate therein day and night, that thou mayest observe to do according to all that is written therein: for then thou shalt make thy way prosperous, and then thou shalt have good success.
 - The only people who will have this kind of success are those who meditate day and night on the Word.
 - **Ps 119:9-11** Those who succeed at resisting temptation are those who have hidden His Word in their hearts.
 - **Ps 19:7-11** There is great reward for meditating and keeping His Word.
 - The Holy Spirit is totally committed to nourishing you, teaching you and speaking to you by the process of washing you with the water of the Word.

Daily Meditation

- In order to experience the POWER of the Scriptures, we must obey. However, in order to obey, we must be in it daily.
 - The reason the bible is ineffective for most Christians is that they simply do not read it.
 - o Anyone who wants to hear God's voice on a regular basis will have to become intimately acquainted with the written Word of God.

He is Talking to Me

- When you start to hear from God, He starts to talk to you about yourself.
- God's voice creates something new in our lives that we didn't have before.
 - o Direction/guidance for your life
 - Ps 32:8 I will instruct thee and teach thee in the way, which thou shalt go: I will *guide* thee with mine eye.
 - Luke 1:79 To give light to them that sit in darkness and in the shadow of death, to guide our feet into the way of peace.
 - Counsel
 - **Judges 18:5** And they said unto him, Ask counsel, we pray thee, of God, that we may know whether our way which we go shall be prosperous.
 - Ps 73:24 Thou shalt guide me with thy counsel, and afterward receive me to glory.
 - o Instructions
 - Acts 8:25-40 Phillip obeyed God to speak to the Eunuch and he was supernaturally transported.
 - Specific details
 - Transported 25 miles after his obedience
 - Blessings of hearing and obeying
 - Chastening of the Lord
 - **Heb 12:5-11** For whom the Lord loves he *chastens* (tutor/educate)
 - **2 Tim 3:16** All Scripture is give by inspiration of God and is profitable for doctrine, for reproof, for correction, for *instruction* in righteousness.
 - o Teaching
 - **1 John 2:27** The anointing abides in you and you need not that any man teach you (*Increase in understanding*).

Practice Hearing God

- Sometimes, it's just one word from God
 - o STOP!!!
 - o Be faithful and it'll open a sentence
- Start with the little stuff:
 - Exercise your senses
 - Ask God which way to go.
 - When the phone rings, ask God who is calling.
 - What will be the next song in worship?
 - What will Pastor preach on next Sunday?
 - When watching a TV show—even if it is a bad one, ask God to speak to you through it.
 - Why did this person come to my mind?

- Observe four people -What emotions are you feeling about them?
 - Start with family member so that you can ask them if you were correct.
 - * Tell them you're practicing hearing God's voice
- Look at an item and ask God to say something to you that is edifying.

A Rhema Word

- There is a difference between studying scripture and hearing scripture speak to you because God is speaking to you.
 - When a person prays they are simply speaking to or holding a conversation with God.
- For so long we have been instructed, corrected, reproved as well as having our spirits lifted up by the Logos of the word (written) and paying very little attention to the Rhema word (voice) of God.
- Can you hear His voice? Let us take the Holy Ghost hearing test. Take 6 steps:
 - 1. Close your eyes and Rest in Him for a moment
 - 2. Say "Jesus I love you"
 - 3. Say it again "Jesus I love you"
 - 4. Once again "Jesus I love you"
 - 5. Be lovingly bold and ask, "Jesus, do you really love me"?
 - 6. Just be quiet and with great expectation wait for His precious response.
 - Whatever expression of love that He used when He spoke to you, it was conveyed to you by the Holy Spirit.
 - You have just experienced personal Holy Spirit revelation through the Rhema (spoken voice) of God.
- It is great to get a love letter (logos), but it is also so powerful to receive a Rhema (spoken) word from the one you love telling you of their love.
 - o God's love letters to man needs, at times, the reality of His Rhema (voice) to assure us that all is well with our soul.
 - God has two voices by which He speaks to mankind. The two voices of God are the voice of His written word (the logos) and the voice of His spoken word (the Rhema).

Questions for Class #3

- 1. Do you spend time every day in the (logos) written Word? What is your devotional time like in the written Word of God? We must make time to not only read but also meditate on the scriptures in a private devotional time, in order to hear the voice of God.

The Rhema Word is a quickened word. It is a word of Scripture or a word from the Lord supernaturally dropped into our mind and spirit causing it to come alive with power. It causes the believer to have no doubt. This Word floods our entire being with faith.

- Read the notes and scriptures in section "A Rhema Word".
- According to Romans 10:17, what will it take for your faith to grow?

The phrase 'Word of God' in this text is the Greek word 'Rhema of God'. As you hear the spoken Word of God, faith comes.

- Satan has only three major temptations. In 1 John 2:16, the Word tells us they are the lust of flesh, lust of eyes and the pride of life. In Matt 4:1-10, Jesus, our Master Swordsman, shows us how to use the 'Rhema' Word of God to defeat the demonic powers in your life. Read these Scriptures before answering the following questions.

An Inner Witness - The Spirit of Man Spoken to by the Holy Spirit

- There is no voice in the Bible apart from the living person of God.

 - Ez 28 Satan was corrupted by reason of his brightness, wisdom and beauty.
- When you're looking for God's voice, don't look for something weird or something strange.
 - o Just listen for a voice and make sure you always filter it through His Word.
 - o He'll never ask you to do anything contrary to His Word or speak contrary to the character of the one who wrote this book.

- **Prov 6:20-22** Take the Word of God and continually bind them on your heart.
 - o The word will guide you when you walk about.
 - o When you sleep, they'll watch over you.
 - o And when you're awake, they'll talk to you.
- We were made to hear God in our inner man.
 - o 1 Peter 3:4 The hidden man of the heart.
- **Romans 8:14** For as many as are led by the Spirit of God, they are the sons of God.
 - The mature (*Huios*) sons know how to communicate with the Father through their spirit.
 - o God is not a respecter of persons but He is a responder of persons. (Rom 2:11)

 - Your human spirit inside you that God uses, brings enlightenment and understanding.
 - You hear God with your human spirit the voice of your heart not the voice of your head.

 - Before you were born again, you had a spirit but it wasn't the candle of the Lord.

You've Been Born Again

- The life and nature of God has made us new. BORN-AGAIN
- The Holy Spirit comes to dwell in our spirit not our mind.

- o He does not communicate directly with our mind.
- o We receive information from the Holy Spirit through our spirit.
- o However, our spirit does influence our intellectual process from within.
 - God uses our spirit to enlighten us; to guide and direct us
 - He speaks to us by an inward witness.

The New Birth

- When a man is born again, the spirit (which is the real man) is born again and the old man is gone.
 - o The old hard, stony heart is gone.
 - He is a new creature.
 - You have been given a new heart and a new spirit from God.
 - Ezek 36:26-27 A new heart & new spirit & Holy Spirit
 - 2 Cor 5:17 Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.
 - The life of God that comes into our spirit is the nature and the life of God, which re-creates our spirit and makes us new creatures in Christ Jesus. (Rom 6:23, John 5:26, John 10:10).
 - o God informs our spirit and our spirit passes the info onto our mind.
 - God doesn't normally inject thoughts directly into your mind from the outside. Instead, He speaks to our spirit, our spirit translates it into a thought, and we form a picture with understanding.
 - If you've put God's Word first place in your life, you've trained your spirit through the Word and your conscience (inner thoughts) will be a safe guide. It will become the voice of God speaking to you in decisions you need to make.
 - The conscience is the inner voice of the human spirit in which God's voice is heard.
- If the Word is planted, what will come forth from your spirit?
 - o Put the Word in your eyes, ears, mouth
 - o Meditate on the Word day and night until you believe with your heart.
 - God's Word is spirit food 3 meals a day
 - If God is going to guide you, you must have a spirit that's developed to a certain maturity to understand what God is going to be communicating.
 - o The Words/Voice of God is compatible with the Born-Again spirit
 - Like a computer and certain software.

- An old/ancient computer won't be able to take new updated state of the art software.
- Not compatible with the flesh only the spirit

Be a Doorkeeper to Your Heart

- My heart has the capacity and power to multiply whatever seed is planted.
 - We are the gatekeepers of our heart.
 - **Prov 23:7** For as he thinketh in his heart, so is he.
 - **Prov 16:1-2** The preparations of the heart in man, and the answer of the tongue, is from the LORD. All the ways of a man are clean in his own eyes; but the LORD weigheth the spirits.
- Acts 16:14 The Lord opened Lydia's heart
 - o The ear you hear God with is in the center of your H"EAR"T

We are to desire Him with all that is in us. Our soul is supposed to yearn for him. We are to cry out for the living God (Ps 84:1-2). This will happen when we commune with Him by meditating on His Word day and night. I encourage you to practice His presence in your life all the time. It's well worth the time spent with Him. It'll keep your heart pure. Blessed are the pure in heart for they shall see God (Matt 5:8).

God is Listening to You

■ Jer 33:1-3

- Jeremiah was put in prison for proclaiming that Babylon would capture Judah because of their sin of disobedience.
 - He needed to be reassured from God that He was in control of the nation in general and of his life in particular.
 - When we pour out our hearts to God, we can know there is someone on the other end of the line who not only promises to listen, but also promises to answer.

■ Prayer is a dialogue not a monologue

- o Dialogue=Two way conversation
- o Monologue=One way conversation

■ God not only speaks to us, He also listens to us.

○ We pray \rightarrow He listens \rightarrow we listen \rightarrow He speaks.

- o He listens carefully and thoroughly and gives His full attention when you talk.
- o So, one of the primary ways God speaks is through prayer.

Jesus Models a Prayer Life

■ Prayer is a vital tool to hearing the voice of our God.

- Prayer is so vital that the disciples wanted Jesus to teach them how to pray properly in Luke 11:1.
- o Jesus spent much time in prayer, going off in the night to be alone with His Father.
 - Luke 18:1 Jesus was disciplined in His prayer life. He told His disciples to always be praying and not to lose heart.
 - Jesus did not limit His times of prayer to crisis only.
 - Whether He was tired or rested, hungry or satisfied, Jesus prayed.

■ You must take the time to pray.

o Mark 1:35 And in the morning, rising up a great while before day, he went out, and departed into a solitary place, and there prayed.

o Many important decisions should not be made until you spend time in prayer.

What Does God Communicate to us in Prayer?

- He gives direction, peace and His desire.
 - o GUIDANCE:
 - Luke 6:12-13 And it came to pass in those days, that he went out into a mountain to pray, and continued all night in prayer to God. And when it was day, he called unto him his disciples: and of them He chose twelve, whom also he named apostles;
 - **James 4:13-16** Don't forge ahead in your plans until consulting the Lord for His guidance and will.
 - To avoid costly mistakes
 - Joshua 9:14 The Gibeonites tricked the Israelites into making a peace treaty with them.
 - Vs 14 And the men took of their victuals, and asked not counsel at the mouth of the LORD.
 - Israelites had to suffer the consequences of not asking for counsel of the Lord.
 - **James 1:5** Ask wisdom of God who gives liberally.
 - Prayer should not be your last resort when you need advice.
 - Our responsibility is to ask for guidance and His responsibility is to give it to us.
 - o PEACE:
 - Worry & fear will hinder God's voice in your life.
 - Corrie ten Boom once observed, "Worry doesn't empty tomorrow of its sorrow; it empties today of its strength".
 - **Phil 4:6** Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God.
 - Paul was in prison when he wrote this Scripture.
 - He was waiting for the verdict in his trial that would determine whether he would live or die.
 - When you decide to pray instead of worry, Phil 4:7 is activated in your life.
 PEACE
 - **Phil 4:7** And the peace of God, which passeth all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.

- o HIS DESIRES:
 - In Chapters 1 & 2 of Nehemiah, he goes before the Lord in prayer and fasting to hear what He has to say.
- Nehemiah had a burden to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem.

- o Neh 2:12 This was God's desire placed in Nehemiah.
- Acts 10:30-32 Cornelius: thy prayer is heard, and thine alms are had in remembrance in the sight of God.
 - Cornelius was praying and fasting for 4 days.
 - Here we see God's desire for Cornelius to know the truth and he sends for Peter to reveal who the Messiah was.
- o Acts 12:4-11 Peter in prison rescued by an angel
 - Prayer was made without ceasing of the church unto God for him.

• It is the Father's heart to heal and He needs our prayers.

o **James 5:16-18** Confess your faults one to another, and pray one for another, that ye may be healed. The effectual fervent prayer of a righteous man availeth much.

Making Time for God

- Do you make time in your daily schedule to allow God to speak to you?
 - o Allow Him to speak to you on these issues:
 - Sins that need to be dealt with
 - **Ps 139:23-24** Let the Holy Spirit's spotlight shine in those dark areas of your life to reveal where you are missing the mark with God and your brother.
 - Is unforgiveness in your heart toward anyone?
 - Matt 5:23-24 Be Reconciled to your brother
 - Are there commands that need to be obeyed that you might not have followed through on?
 - **Ps 119:34-35** Give me understanding, and I shall keep thy law; yea, I shall observe it with my whole heart. Make me to go in the path of thy commandments; for therein do I delight.

 - Prayer is ultimately aligning your will with God's will, your desires with His
 desires and submitting yourself to His sovereign plan. This brings
 supernatural peace.
- Why aren't more people praying and listening for God's voice, the Supreme Ruler of the universe, since He has promised to communicate with us if we do?

A Place and Time Reserved for God

- A set time is important to listen to God.
 - o For Jesus, it was...
 - Luke 9:29, 32 Late night
 - o Mark 1:35 Early morning-great while before day (still dark)
 - **Output Luke 5:15-16 Mid-day**
- A quiet place to pray is also important.
 - o Luke 9:18 He was alone praying.
 - o Luke 9:28 He went into the mountains.
 - o Luke 5:16 He withdrew into the wilderness.
 - o Mark 1:35 He departed into a solitary place.
- Have your bible, note pad and pen ready to journal.
 - o Record what God is saying to you.
 - o God can tell that you are serious with Him by your attentiveness to record what His instructions, impressions, guidance and desires are for us.

- God's thoughts are different from our thoughts. Is 55:8-9
 - o He has a different perspective on the situations in our life.
 - o In Fact, His solution may be entirely opposite of what you would do.
- His voice is in line with His Word, the Logos (written):
 - His voice never contradicts scripture.
 - o **2 Cor 1:20** For all the promises of God in him are yea, and in him Amen, unto the glory of God by us.
- God's voice has His character:
 - o He is consistent, always the same.
 - o God's voice doesn't whine, cry, nag, push, argue, yell, scream, it isn't mean, condemning or accusing.
 - o God's voice is calm, still, quiet, soft, confident, kind, loving, merciful and gentle.
 - o God exhorts, encourages and comforts.
 - 2 Cor 1:3-4the Father of mercies, and the God of all comfort; Who comforteth us in all our tribulation.
 - Convicts us through the Holy Spirit of our sin and shows us the way to repentance and forgiveness.
 - **John 8:3** Woman found in adultery
- God's voice will produce good fruit.
 - o If we are accurately hearing God's voice, our lives will reflect His fruit in them.
- Requires faith to wait & courage to hold your ground
 - Ps 27:14 Wait on the LORD: be of good courage, and he shall strengthen thine heart: wait, I say, on the LORD.

- Peace floods your soul.
 - o Security in the midst of questions and turmoil
 - **John 14:27** Peace I leave with you...
 - Peace will umpire in your heart.
 - Col 3:15 And let the peace of God rule in your hearts, to the which also ye are called in one body; and be ye thankful.
 - What does your heart say?
 - You will have peace in your heart.

- Confidence, assurance, and rest follow.
 - o Is 30:15 In quietness and in confidence shall be your strength.
- The Lordship of Jesus Christ:
 - o Satan and his demon hordes will not call Jesus Christ "Lord".
 - 1 Cor 12:3 Wherefore I give you to understand, that no man speaking by the Spirit
 of God calleth Jesus accursed: and that no man can say that Jesus is the Lord, but
 by the Holy Ghost.
- Confirmation
 - o God always confirms His Words to you especially for guidance.
 - o **2 Cor 13:1** This is the third time I am coming to you. In the mouth of two or three witnesses shall every word be established.
- He doesn't seem to speak very plain.
 - The reason is because the things that are very clear in the Word, we ignore and disobey them.
 - o Therefore, He speaks in dark sayings so that you will have to search Him out and develop a relationship with Him in order to find out what He is saying.
- God wants friendship so He appears distant.
 - He is playing hide and seek.
 - God wants relationship but we want results.
 - He wants to talk but we want a quick fix.

o Friendship is the key to recognizing His voice

When the Devil and His Demonic Powers Speak

- Doubt, fear and discomfort
 - o **2 Tim 1:7** For God hath not given us the spirit of fear; but of power, and of love, and of a sound mind.
 - o **Rom 8:15** For ye have not received the spirit of bondage again to fear; but ye have received the Spirit of adoption, whereby we cry, Abba, Father.
- Conflict, restlessness and no peace
 - O James 3:14 But if ye have bitter envying and strife in your hearts, glory not, and lie not against the truth.
 - o **Isa 48:22** There is no peace, saith the LORD, unto the wicked.
- Confusion:
 - o Satan is the author of confusion
 - o **James 3:16** For where envying and strife is, there is confusion and every evil work.
- Satan causes you to place your eyes on yourself.

- His voice demands that you qualify for the task and this causes you to take your eyes off God and onto yourself.
- Lordship of Christ denied
 - o **I Jn 4:3** And every spirit that confesseth not that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh is not of God: and this is that spirit of antichrist, whereof ye have heard that it should come; and even now already is it in the world.
- Condemnation
 - o Satan brings up sins already confessed, forgiven, and forgotten by God.
 - Rom 8:1 There is therefore now no condemnation to them which are in Christ Jesus, who walk not after the flesh, but after the Spirit.
 - I Jn 3:20-21 For if our heart condemn us, God is greater than our heart, and knoweth all things. Beloved, if our heart condemn us not, then have we confidence toward God.
- The Word of God is questioned.
 - O Gen 3:1 Now the serpent was more subtle than any beast of the field which the LORD God had made. And he said unto the woman, Yea, hath God said, Ye shall not eat of every tree of the garden?
- Contradiction of God's Word
 - o Gen 3:4 And the serpent said unto the woman, Ye shall not surely die:
- God's character is maligned.
 - o **Gen 3:5** For God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil.
- It will appeal to the flesh.
 - Gen 3:6 And when the woman saw that the tree was good for food, and that it was pleasant to the eyes, and a tree to be desired to make one wise, she took of the fruit thereof, and did eat, and gave also unto her husband with her; and he did eat.

When the Flesh/Self Speaks

- EMOTIONS—WHERE THE DEVIL OPERATES
- The soul realm is where the devil attacks you.
 - o Every problem you have has to do with emotions.
 - Finances, marriage, body
 - May not even be REALITY.
 - Emotions don't know reality.
 - They only react to what my mind told them.
 - o Emotions produce actions that the devil has designed to destroy us.
 - When we yield to our emotions, we enter into sin.

- Rom 8:13 If you live after the flesh, you shall die.
- o When you live in your emotions, you're in the flesh because the emotions are in the flesh realm.
- o Bad emotions produce bad decisions -> ruined life
 - Leads to doing things to make flesh feel better ease the tantrum of the flesh.
- We must subject our emotions and senses for training to the Word of God.

Emotional Freedom – Exempt from Control

- **Isa 26:3** Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he trusteth in thee.
- We try to eliminate problems to get peace.
 - o In the problem is an answer from God!
 - We must reach the place where our emotions become more stimulated by the Word than they are by circumstances and that our senses are willing to believe the Word in the absence of physical evidence.
- Make decisions based on what the Word says not what our emotions want.
 - Even though your emotions are rising up on the inside of you, don't rise up in response to them.

o Don't live to feel better—live to produce better (BETTER PRODUCE).			

Clues When Your Flesh is Speaking

- Hesitation:
 - Self has to think before it speaks.
 - o God's Word to us flows easily.
- Deception:
 - We can go astray with our own hearts since we do not fully understand ourselves.
 - We must feed on the Word until our heart is full of the **fruits of the spirit**.
 - O Jer 17:9-10 The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked: who can know it? I the LORD search the heart, I try the reins, even to give every man according to his ways, and according to the <u>fruit</u> of his doings.
 - o Heb 5:12-14 are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat.
- Double-mindedness:
 - o Wanting two opposite things at the same time results in instability
 - o **James 1:8** A double minded man is unstable in all his ways.
 - We need to stay focus on Jesus and let Him take care of everything in our life.
 - Matt 6:22-23 The light of the body is the eye.....If therefore the light that is in thee be darkness, how great is that darkness!

of control, which related to our thinking processes, we could end up like the people
before the flood that hurt the heart of our God. In Ps 10:4, the wicked people had a
prideful thought life. Who did they never think about?

Remember God desires for us to have fullness of life with Him as our main focus.

Sin and Neglecting God's Ways

- The Holy Spirit speaks to us through our trials for either sin or neglect of something important to God.
 - Malachi: Pest Economics
 - Mal 3:6-12 Neglected God's way to bless others
 - Pests were devouring their crops and investments were failing.
 - Severe conditions were a message from God.
 - They neglected the tithe so God withdrew his protection from their economic endeavors.
 - o Joel: Invasion of the vegetation snatchers
 - **Joel 1:1-7** Pleasure seekers & drunkards
 - A locust invasion was used as a voice of God to the people to repent or a greater invasion would occur.
 - o Haggai: People stopped the building of the temple
 - **Hag 1:6** The harder they worked, the less they had to show for it.
 - The people were not lazy, they were working hard building their own houses but neglecting God's house.
 - Their circumstances were telling them something. They were under a curse—pay attention to the things of God.

pay attention to the things of God.

Unpleasant and Common Events

- He can speak to us through unpleasant circumstances.
 - o Do you ask God through these circumstances what He is trying to tell you?
 - o Do you consider that unpleasant events are just part of life or do you analyze them to see if through them, God is trying to tell you something?
 - o Many trials are prolonged because we don't realize that we're failing to hear God saying something to us.
- He speaks through common events.
 - o 1 Sam 15:27-28 Saul & Samuel
 - o Saul grabbed Samuel's robe and tore it.
 - o If you are being drawn to a specific event in your life, be alert that God may be speaking to you through it.

Observe Your Experiences

- Observe human experiences. Notice things of daily life.
 - o **Ps 1:1** Notice that he 1st walks, 2nd stands, 3rd sits
 - Observe how God deals with you.
 - The Holy Spirit speaking to you repeatedly through your experiences.
 - o God's voice is speaking to us through our experiences but most of us have trained ourselves to ignore it and go about our business as if He is not there.
 - Reflect, consider, meditate on scripture and come before God humbly asking for wisdom and understanding to apply the scripture.
 - Matt 4:6 Jesus on the Mount of Temptation
 - Satan left out a part "to keep thee in all thy ways".
 - Jesus knew this was not the voice of His Father because He knew the Word.
 - It didn't line up with the Word in **Psalm 91:11**.
- Every thought, intuition, speech, revelation, dream, vision, advice, perception, event, circumstance, experience must be censored by the Word of God.

 Of God is the one speaking to us, it'll pass the x-ray test of His Word.

God Allows Circumstances to Help Us Fly

- The Way of the Eagle:
 - **Deut 32:11** Catch the Way of the Wind of the Holy Spirit because He is drawing you up higher.
 - She will take sticks and branches to build her nest, down feathers from her own breast and other soft things like rabbit skins, etc. to make it soft.
 - o Lays her eggs and broods over them until they hatch.
 - o Little eaglets are born and all they do is have their little mouth opened to be fed.
 - Moving from baby stage to maturity.
 - The purpose of an eaglet is learning how to fly.
- An eagle stirs up her nest
 - o Circumstances change on you
 - She takes her beak, pierces a hole in the nest, takes some of that soft stuff, pulls it out, and drops it 10,000 feet into the valley.
 - o When mom is done, everything soft has been taken out of the nest.
- When your nest is stirred up, look out because the Holy Spirit is ready to do something.
 - The Holy Spirit is stripping things from you to make you feel uneasy in order to move you to the next level—to fly.

- God gives ability, gifts, anointing, vision, spiritual strength, drive, energy, time and He tells us to do something with it.
- He stands on the side and stirs up the nest.
 - When God starts to stir up the nest, He's telling you that you've been there long enough.
 - o When these times come, they seem like hard blows to your life.
 - When the nest is stirred, all God is going to do is take you higher and show you how to fly.

Come Up Higher

- No great men in the bible ever walked in greatness without having their nest stirred.
 - Moses at 40 years of age grabbed an Egyptian and killed him. He had a 40-year desert experience after that until it was his time to fly back to Egypt.
 - Joseph's brothers sold him into slavery for 13 years at which time he worked for Potifar. Potifar's wife accuses him of molesting her and he ends in prison. From there he became 2nd in charge of all of Egypt.
 - Samuel anointed David king but Saul wouldn't receive David. He hunted him down to kill him. David eventually became king of Israel.
 - o Daniel was thrown in the lions den in his 90s.
- The Eagle flutters over her young
 - o Flutter: hovers in mid-air as she catches the wind.
 - o Only eagles have hollow bones and can ride the wind like no other bird.
 - o Learn that the wind is your friend.
- **Prov 30:19** The way of an eagle in the air a mystery
 - Master the air currents.
 - Learn the way of the wind.
 - o **John 3:1-8** Nichodemus: Can't see the wind or which way it's coming from.
 - We are little eaglets trying to pick the direction of the wind and negotiate the wind in our life, which is the Holy Spirit.
- Learn to be sensitive to the blowing of the wind.
 - o A powerful way God operates in our lives and we don't know how to respond to it.
 - Is God blowing on you?
 - o Are you learning to follow the way of the wind?
 - o The wind of the Holy Spirit is sensitive and we're not to grieve Him.
 - O How does the Holy Spirit feel when He's been breathing on your life and He's been sending winds your way, sending opportunities and you're so caught up with security/a comfortable nest that you've become insensitive to His voice?

- Luke 4:1-14 Jesus was full of the Holy Spirit going into the wilderness and came out with power.
 - What was in between the fullness of the Holy Spirit and the power of the Holy Spirit? The wilderness!
 - o Sometimes in our circumstances, God is leading us into a wilderness experience in order to help us to fly higher in Him.
- Learn to discern the circumstances, events and experiences in our life.
 - o Is God speaking to us to "come up higher"?
 - Learn the way of the wind—learn the voice of the Spirit—He's speaking to us in our daily events.

PERCEPTIONS, IMPRESSIONS, MIRACLES, SIGNS & AN AUDIBLE VOICE

Many Ways But Only Three Experiences

- The Lord speaks by many different ways/avenues but He uses three (3) experiences:
 - o Quickening: Make alive or give vitality
 - All of the Lord's Words must be quickened by the Holy Spirit.
 - Quickening happens when you hear a story, etc. and all of a sudden it connects with your personal life. The Spirit says, "Listen, I'm talking to you".
 - 1 **Cor 6:17** We are one spirit with the Lord.
 - o Revelation: Disclose, reveal, make manifest, appear, to lighten, bring to light
 - A sudden awareness of the Lord's Presence or Word
 - A deeper understanding
 - As soon as your spirit receives the revelation, it downloads it to your mind.
 - o Discernment:
 - **Heb 5:13-14** For anyone who continues to live on milk (Phi) does not know what is right (NEB) he simply has not grown up (Phi). But 'solid food' is for Christians of mature faith (TCNT) that is, for those who through constant practice have their spiritual faculties carefully trained (Wey) to discriminate between what is good and what is bad for him (Phi).
 - As a baby grows, he comes off milk and needs meat to grow strong and healthy.
 - This world has many inputs into your life. By putting in the Word daily, we are able to discern the healthy stuff from the poison. We are able to discern good from evil.
 - The Holy Spirit and the Word in your spirit will tell you that there is deception in what is being said.
 - When you hear a deceptive voice, your spirit will pick it up quickly.
 - The Word separated you TO the Truth and deception won't settle in.
 - If you're only separated from something and not also <u>TO</u> the Word, you'll fall for anything.
 - The Word of God, where your hearing is concerned, will separate you from wrong hearing into a position you can hear from God and know it's the Holy Spirit.

Perceptions

■ Become aware of through the senses; taste, touch, hear, smell, see; apprehend with the mind; to come to understanding; to know intuitively or experientially.

- Mark 2:8 And immediately when <u>Jesus perceived in his spirit</u> that they so reasoned within themselves, he said unto them, why reason ye these things in your hearts? Man sick with palsy who they lowered from the roof
- Acts 14:9 The same heard Paul speak: who steadfastly beholding him, and <u>perceiving</u> that he had faith to be healed,
 - Paul heals a crippled man at Lystra and the people thought he and Barnabas were gods.
- **Luke 9:47** And Jesus, *perceiving* the thought of their heart, took a child, and set him by him...
 - The disciples wondering who would be the greatest among them
- Matt 22:17-18 Tell us therefore, What thinkest thou? Is it lawful to give tribute unto Caesar, or not? But Jesus *perceived* their wickedness, and said, Why tempt ye me, ye hypocrites?
- 1 Sam 3:8 And the LORD called Samuel again the third time. And he arose and went to Eli, and said, Here am I; for thou didst call me. And Eli *perceived* that the LORD had called the child.

Impressions

- Similar to notions, inklings, influence, profound effect produced on the mind, a design produced by pressure, an imprint or mark by pressure.
 - o **Song 1:4** Draw me, we will run after thee.
 - John 6:44 No man can come to me, except the Father which hath sent me draw him:
 - Being impressed by a certain book of the Bible to read during devotions or maybe a notion to read a devotional book
 - Maybe a sense to read a certain chapter and verse to find out it was just what you needed to hear from the Lord.
 - You know when an impression is upon your heart much like a steer knows when the impression of the hot iron has touched his body.
- Neh 7:5 And my <u>God put into mine heart</u> (impressed upon my heart) to gather together the nobles, and the rulers, and the people, that they might be reckoned by genealogy. And I found a register of the genealogy of them which came up at the first, and found written therein,
 - o It wasn't the audible voice of God but an influence put upon his heart.
 - He realized that it was God, and not himself, who wanted this done. It was God, who had placed this desire in his heart.
- John 13:2 And supper being ended, the devil having now <u>put into the heart</u> of Judas Iscariot, Simon's son, to betray him;

- o Satan impressed upon Judas a thought to betray Jesus.
- o He does the same to us. It's his avenue of deception.
- **Exodus 35:21-22** Those whose *hearts were stirred*/prompted by God's Spirit returned with their offerings...all as their heart prompted them.
 - o But God can also impress upon our hearts the things He desires of us.

Miracles

- Jesus turns water into wine.
 - o **John 2:1-11** He is Lord over nature.
- All the miracles He did
 - He is LORD who delivers.
- The ax floating on the top of the water.

■ John 14:12 Greater works will we do.

- o II Ki 6:5-6 Elisha made an axe head float.

Signs

- After Pentecost, signs were generally given to those not seeking them.
- Acts 1:24-26 The last supernatural sign in the Bible was when the Apostles were choosing lots to see who would replace Judas.
 - o After this, the signs came unexpectedly.
 - o Acts 9:3-6 Paul's conversion on the road to Damascus
 - The desire for a sign is usually because of unbelief—motivated by a lack of faith.
 - o Matt 12:38-39 Scribes and Pharisees asking for a sign
 - They needed to obey the part they did know instead of looking for the part that God has hidden from them.
 - We need to learn to walk with Him step by step in faith instead of pressing Him to unfold for us His entire plan for our lives at one time.
 - o Signs are given as a confirmation not a contradiction to the Word.
- The signs given were for the proclamation of the Gospel not every day affairs.
 - o Common sense usually takes the place of supernatural signs
 - Wisdom in disguise/common sense = signs
- Fleece is a comfortable way to get our soul satisfied.
 - o Making a contract with God on your terms.
 - o You asking God to answer your way not His.
- **Judges 6:39-40** Gideon's fleece was asked for with great respect
 - o He paid a price for it. It was not without consequence.
 - o Gideon had to cut his army down to 300.

- Fleeces suggest a flexible part of God's nature but in reality, we need to be the flexible ones.
 - o It suggests that we're testing God to see how far He will bend.
 - o God will allow this method for a season but He wants us to grow up and grow out of this type of relationship with Him.

An Audible Voice

- Hearing someone's voice forms a personal connection to him or her.
 - o Song of Solomon 2:14 The lover longs to hear His beloved's voice.
 - o Jesus' voice is sweet to His followers as well.
- Even though knowing a persons voice may give us more information about them or draw us closer to them, God's voice may cause uncertainty.
 - o **Deut 4:12** No form only a voice
 - o John 12:28-29 Thunder or an angel's voice
- The voice of the Lord is majestic
 - o Is 30:30 Glorious voice (splendor/majesty in Greek)
- His voice may stir up great fear.
 - o **Deut 5:26** Who has heard the voice and lived?
 - o Ezek 43:2 Voice was like a noise of many waters...
 - o **Heb 12:19** The sound of a trumpet
 - o 2 Sam 22:14 The Lord thundered from heaven....
 - o **Job 37:2** Raging thunder/crash
 - o Ps 18:13 The Lord also thundered in the heavens...
 - Exod 19:15-20 There were thunders and lightnings, and a thick cloud upon the
 mount, and the voice of the trumpet exceeding loud; so that all the people that was
 in the camp trembled.
- The clearer the revelation, the harder the task.
 - o Notice those who heard the voice of God audibly.
 - Jesus, Moses, Ezekiel, Samuel, Job, Peter, James, John

The voice of God is a majestic voice. When Jesus spoke as a human being, His voice was like ours. However, when He speaks with His glorified body voice, it is majestic.

God Speaks in Five Different Ways

- Number 12:1-8
 - o Dream: The least interference with the conscious mind.
 - A window into our heart
 - o Vision: Our mind is active but the Holy Spirit is in charge.
 - O Direct speech: mouth to mouth
 - Dark speech: 2420 Chidhah; parables, riddle, proverb, trick, maxim (brief statement of a general principle, truth or rule of conduct)
 - **Judges 14:12-19** Samson's riddle
 - Something hard to decipher without inside information
 - o Similitude: 8544 *timunah*: it is something shaped, a fashioning, a form, an appearance, an image, a phantom, an embodiment, a manifestation, a likeness.

■ Num 12:8 Moses witnessed a manifestation of God's glory when He passed by							

What is a Vision?

- Definition: Redemptive revelation; an experience of the sight; it is a literal, spiritual or physical happening; it is not a product of the mind, imagination or logic.
- There are two kinds of vision: internal & external
 - o Internal: Seen with the inner eye: If you wake up from a dream and you cannot tell whether it is real or not, you probably had a vision.
 - Something/picture that has been revealed to you by God that came up on your soul from your spirit and you got an image of it in your mind.
 - Acts 10:10 Peter's vision of the unclean animals
 - Acts 16:9 And a vision appeared to Paul in the night; There stood a man of Macedonia, and prayed him, saying, come over into Macedonia, and help us.
 - o External:
 - Co-existing spiritual realm
 - 2 Kings 6: 15-17 Elisha's servant who saw the Syrian army and God opened his eyes to see the army of God.
 - Seeing angels and demons
 - Acts 12:9 Peter's vision
 - Why did Peter think he saw a vision?

- Because the vision he had in the past seemed real.
- Acts 10:3-7 An angel appears to Cornelius in a vision.
- Acts 23 Jesus appears to Paul to encourage him.
- Open heaven
 - Seeing an open heaven and the throne of God
 - Acts 7:56 Steven saw an open heaven.
 - Paul's vision/trance of Jesus on the road to Damascus
 - See Jacob's Dream: Gen 28:12-19
- Realm of the future
 - **Dan 10:1-7** Future events
 - John in the Book of Revelation
- o A vision within a Dream
 - Visions come veiled in a dream
 - **Dan 4:9** O Belteshazzar, tell me the *visions of my dream* that I have seen, and the interpretation thereof.
 - **Is 29:7** And the multitude of all the nations that fight against Ariel, even all that fight against her and her munition, and that distress her, shall be as *a dream of a night vision*.

Where Do Visions Come From?

- When a man has a vision, it comes from the heart.
- The heart is the Key: God's workshop
- Swinging door between physical and spiritual realm
 - When the Word of God takes root in your heart, it gives birth on the inside of you and becomes a part of you.
 - The Holy Spirit will correct our wrong thinking and attitude through a vision/trance experience.
- Acts 10:10-22 Peter and the "unclean animals to eat" vision
- Throw open the window of your heart and receive the sound of heaven!
 - O Your conscience is like a window between soul and spirit.
 - o Make sure nothing is clouding your conscience.

What is the Purpose of Visions?

- Num 12:6 It is God's way of making Himself known to us.
- Visions are God's picture language.
 - o They are more literal than a dream.

- Acts 2:17 Young men having visions; young are not as seasoned as the old and therefore, since visions are more literal, they are much easier to understand.
- Old men see dreams; more seasoned person can understand dreams since they are more metaphoric and symbolic.
- Visions can carry an emotional and spiritual impact that dreams will not carry.
 - o God etches it in your mind
 - o Dreams can disappear—they're fleeting
- God's presence was with Moses but His presence is IN us!!!
 - o How can our power be less than Moses?
 - o If Moses could deliver millions, we can do more.
- The Lord has a vision and He is pouring out his vision and His dream on His people.
- Every believer should be having visions and every Christian should be having dreams.
- He is removing the scales of unbelief from our eyes so that we can have dream & vision experiences.

We must not stay babies.	. We are called to grow and enlarge our territory.	

How Can I Receive Visions?

- You must grow some roots.
- You must plant water on the inside of your heart.
 - o Get the water of the Word of God, and plant it in your heart and stay in it.
 - o STAY, STAY, STAY IN THE WATER
 - o Eventually you'll grow roots.
 - o Those roots will spring forth and come up and out in the form of visions.
- God is achieving His vision, dreams and plans through people whose hearts He has touched, and who are embracing His purposes; those who burn so intensely for Him that they don't want to live for anything else but to see God's will done on this earth in their lives and to be actively involved in it.
- God has always been looking for people whom He could fulfill His plan through.
- Joel 2:28 And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, your young men shall see visions:
- Read the accounts of the visions received by Daniel, John, Isaiah & Ezekiel and allow God to give you understanding of visions through their visions.

DREAMS GOD'S NIGHT PARABLES

Why Through Dreams?

- The least interference with the conscious mind
 - o A window into our heart It can reveal our own hearts to us.
 - o In sleep through the portal of the subconscious, God can enter to change a heart in conscious rebellion.
- Soul dreams also allow fears to surface in order to be dealt with.
 - Shaded gray type of dreams
- A deception from the enemy to steer us in the wrong direction.
 - o Not only does God use this method of communicating with us, but this method is also used by the demonic realm.
 - This is why we must bring all our dreams under the scrutiny of the Holy Spirit for interpretation.
- **Job 33:14-18** For God speaketh once, yea twice, yet man perceiveth it not.
 - o Whether awake or asleep God wants to instruct and counsel us.
- Since Abraham, God has spoken to man through dreams & visions
 - o 1st Dream: **Genesis 15:12-17** Told about 400 years of captivity for the Hebrews
- God warns, guides, instructs, confirms and converses by way of symbolism in your dreams.
- There are 224 references to dreams or visions in the entire Word of God
 - o There are over 50 references for messages being sent by God through dreams and visions to both the saved and unsaved.
 - o One third of Scripture recounts or relates to a dream or vision.

- I believe most dreams are indeed meaningful and helpful.
- **Ecc 5:1-7** For a dream comes through the multitude of business;
- Most dreams are from God and are accurate reflections of our individual situations.
 - o But they are symbolic and appear meaningless.
 - o Jesus told stories in parable form and He gives us dreams in parable form also.

Purpose for Dreams

- God guides His children by dreams.
 - Dreams are one of God's chosen method of communication.
- A dream is a release of revelation/illumination that comes at a time when your body is at peace and our soul/conscious mind is at rest.
- God can now speak to our human spirit/subconscious mind.
 - o He communicates with us at the spirit level.
- Dreams and visions are picture letters.
 - o Every detail in the dreams and visions are important parts of the overall message.
 - o A single picture contains many elements.
 - o Each element tells part of the overall story.
 - o There are no unimportant elements.
- **Ps 16:7** I will bless the LORD, who hath given me counsel: my reins also instruct me in the night seasons.
 - Our Lord loves us so much He desires for us to have a successful Christian walk. Because of this, He'll instruct us through dreams.
- There are five separate listings in the New Testament of dreams and vision that foretold the birth of Jesus.
- God's MO (method of operation) is the same now as it was 6000 years ago.
 Heb 13:8 Jesus Christ the same yesterday, and today, and forever.

Types of Dreams: God Dreams, Soul Dreams & Demonic Dreams God Dreams

- Warning Dreams
 - For me or someone else to warn of impending danger or to correct me from making a grave mistake.
 - o Gen 20:3 God warned Abimelich that he was flirting with death by taking Abraham's wife—"you're a dead man".
 - o Matt 2:12 Wise men warned not to return to Herod
- Teaching Dreams
 - o Jesus taught Peter in a dream that being prejudice against the gentiles was wrong and that He wanted them saved.
- Prophetic Dreams
 - o **Gen 37:5** Joseph had a dream as a young lad that he would one day save his people.

- Even though the shortest distance between two points is a straight line, with God it's usually a wild rabbit trail that winds around and seems to go nowhere.
- As with Joseph, with such a powerful dream came many trials and testings to prepare him for the call he had.
- The season of delay may be very distasteful and agonizing but very needful to prepare us for the opportunity.
- Our character is formed in those divine delays.
- o Gen 40:5 God foretold the future of the butler and the baker.
- Ministry Dreams
 - o Peter, by a dream, was sent to the gentiles (unclean animals).
 - Sent to Cornelius' house
- Futuristic Revelation Dreams
 - o **Dan 2:19** Nebuchadnezzar had a dream that Daniel interpreted. God revealed a great future event that would effect all creation.
 - The great image
 - o **Gen 41:8** Pharaoh was given a dream by God, which foretold of a great disaster to come upon the land.
 - This was a double dream.
 - o Dan 7:1 Daniel's dream and visions of beasts (future kingdoms)
- Instruction Dreams
 - o Gen 31:10 God showed Jacob in a dream how he would increase his herd of cattle.
 - o Gen 31:24 God warned Laban the Syrian not to talk to Jacob in an angry voice.
 - o Matt 2:13 Joseph warned to take Mary and Jesus to Egypt.
- Encouraging Dreams:

Soul Dreams

- **Jer 23:32** Behold, I am against them that prophesy false dreams, saith the LORD, and do tell them, and cause my people to err by their lies, and by their lightness;
- **Jer 14:14** Then the LORD said unto me, The prophets prophesy lies in my name: I sent them not, neither have I commanded them, neither spake unto them: they prophesy unto you a false vision and divination, and a thing of nought, and the deceit of their heart.
- Some may come from our own carnal minds attempting to lead us away from God's principles and precepts.
 - The flesh wants its own way and will try to persuade you to do what it wants not what God wants.

- **Deut 13:1-3** If someone tells you to go after other gods (your soul dream can do this), the Lord may be testing you to see if you love Him with all your heart.
- Soul dreams can come from wounds and hurts from the past.
 - o If you have a reoccurring dream, it could mean that you're still not healed in that area yet and God wants to do a healing.
 - o These soul dreams are meant to help you heal by causing the incident to become less traumatic as you go over and over it again in a dream.
 - At first, the dream will cause the experience to be magnified in your emotions.
 Nevertheless, God is gracious to allow these wounds to be exposed so that we can be healed from them.
- Ps 64:6 They search out iniquities; they accomplish a diligent search: both the inward thought of every one of them, and the heart, is deep.(KJV) It'll take some digging deep by the Holy Spirit to expose the wound.
- Warning: Be careful not to depend totally on dreams because if it is a soul dream and you think it's from God, you can be lead astray by you incorrect interpretation.
 - o **Prov 28:26** He that trusteth in his own heart is a fool: but whoso walketh wisely, he shall be delivered.
 - We need to be led by the Spirit of God through personal prayer and the study of His Word.

Demonic Dreams

- **Zech 10:2** For the idols have spoken vanity, and the diviners have seen a lie, and have told false dreams;
- If you are having nightmares that are causing fear, anxiety, and terror, it is probably not from God but rather from the soul or you may have allowed demonic influences to penetrate your mind.
 - o Question: What have you allowed your mind to feed on? TV, movies, books, etc.
 - Once thoughts have been planted in your mind, the spirit of fear and other demonic spirits can come to torment and harass you.
- Only God's Word and His Blood can release you from these harassing, fearful dreams.
- If your dream is demonic in nature (not necessarily a nightmare), God may be moving you to a new level of warfare or giving you a warning that the enemy is trying to take ground from you.
- Take all dreams to God in prayer to find out what he wants you to do with them.

Unlocking Your Dreams

- You will quickly learn the difference between your soul dreams and God dreams as you understand the symbols reappearing in your dreams.
- Remember, God will not contradict His Word. Our soul dreams express our soul's desires and happenings.
- Mark 4:22-25 And He said to them, be careful what you are hearing. The measure of thought and study you give to the truth you hear will be the measure of virtue and knowledge that comes back to you and more besides will be given to you who hear.
- Revelation and understanding are hidden from unbelievers and the enemy but not us.
- If you want to understand your dreams, you must give careful study and thought to your dreams.
 - o You must strive for understanding.
- Discernment is the KEY!
- We must NEVER base our life decisions on soulish dreams because our enemy can dislodge us from our destiny in God.
- Some Keys to discern our dreams:
 - 1) Is the message in the dream consistent with the teachings, character and nature of God?
 - 2) Does the message lead to righteousness?
 - 3) Is the message consistent with doctrine and principles of God?
 - 4) Are you impacted by your dream--a stirring in your spirit?
 - 5) Does the dream cause you to search your soul and inner motives?
 - 6) Does the dream continue to come and point to the same area in your life that you know you must deal with?
- Since symbolism is God's picture language, use symbols in the Bible to interpret your dream.
- Hasty dream interpretation should be avoided.

- Reduce the dream to its simplest form.
 - What is the main thought?
 - What object or thought occurs most often?
 - What is your sense and feelings from the dream? Good or evil?
 - What was the primary emotion?
- Create a dream journal; write your dreams down and then pray over them.
 - o By writing them down, you might notice that there is a succession of dreams in a row that tell a story.
- **Job 33:14** For God speaketh once, yea twice, yet man perceiveth it not.
- Include the date of your dream, where you dreamed it and the time.

Three Characteristics to Hear God's Voice

(Surprised by the Voice of God by Jack Deere)

- Availability: Jesus was always available to His Father God.
 - Jesus never took the attitude of trying to find time to fit fellowship with God into His busy schedule.
 - o God the Father owned His day.

■ Willingness:

- o Spiritual discernment is based on our willingness to do God's will.
- o **John 7:16-17** If you are willing to do God's will, you'll know what He says.
- o Could God refrain from speaking to us because He knows we will not obey therefore, causing us to fall into the sin of disobedience?

■ Humility:

- o Definition of Humility: 1 Sam 15:17 "You were once small in your own eyes..."
- o Doesn't mean being worthless, no ability or good qualities.
- o It means, that we have a profound distrust of our own abilities and goodness.
- We have a profound confidence in the mercy of God rather than in man's efforts.
- o A truly humble person knows that no matter how great their abilities or their character, they can do nothing apart from Christ.
- o They are willing to serve people of lower position than themselves.
- o **Ps 138:6** God is intimate with the humble and keeps at arms length the prideful.



- 6. What are the attitudes of the people in the dream? What tone or feeling do they add to the dream?
- 7. Do any of the people symbolize anything to you?
- 8. What are your feelings and attitude?
- 9. What is the tone of the dream: harsh, hope, peace, condemnation, correction, etc?
- 10. What thought remains with you after the dream?
- 11. What is going on in your life at present that could relate to the dream?
- 12. What question lingers after the dream?
- 13. What category do you believe the dream falls into: demonic, godly, soulish?
- 14. Go into prayer and ask God to reveal the interpretation to you.
- 15. Go to the Word of God to get understanding of the dream.
